



# GRACIE

## MATERIALS

2 x 50 gram balls mesh yarn

Pair of 6mm knitting needles

## TENSION

Tension is not important as this is a free flowing yarn.

## MESH YARN KNITTING INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on stitches as follows: (stitches are not cast on the same way as usual).

*Starting at the tail end of your yarn pick up stitches with your right hand needle from back to front of yarn below the upper ribbon edge at intervals of approximately 4-5 cm.*

Commence knitting as follows unless otherwise stated:

*The yarn is held and worked exactly the same as if you are working a regular knit stitch with a slight difference as explained. Commence by knitting into the first stitch on your left hand needle as if to work a knit stitch, the difference being; instead of wrapping your yarn around the needle then slipping off the stitch, you wrap the yarn half way around your left hand needle then pierce through the yarn held in your right hand along the top edge with the point of your left hand needle, continue working as you would a knit stitch thus slipping off the worked stitch as normal. Continue along the stitches this way wrapping and piercing the yarn as described leaving approx. 3.5cm lengths between working each stitch to create ruffles.*

**BAG INSTRUCTIONS** Make 2 alike.

Using 8mm needles cast on 24 stitches

Row 1: Knit using yarn stitch.

Row 2: Knit

Rep rows 1 and 2 until work measures

21cm (8inch) approx

Change to 6mm needles Garter stitch 4

Rows.

Cast off

## HANDLE

Using 6mm needles Cast on 40

stitches

Garter stitch 5 rows, cast off

## MAKE UP

With Right sides together stitch side seams of bag.

Stitch the short edges of the handle to the inside side seams of bag.

Stitch together the bottom edge of bag.

*You could make a lining for your bag if you desire.*
